GREG SMITH 1948 - 1988

In the early hours of the morning of Tuesday March 22nd, 1988, one of our long serving club members, Greg Smith, passed away.

Greg had been unwell for about six weeks. He was rushed to hospital on Sunday March 12th, where he was placed under intensive care, but unfortunately lapsed into a coma from which he never awoke.

I first heard of his condition the following day when his chances of surviving 24 hours were considered remote. With the aid of life support equipment clinical life was maintained for a further week.

Although Greg had not attended many club rides or meetings in recent times, due mainly to shift work in his employment as a train driver, he remained a member of the club, having first joined the Motor Scooter and Cycle Association in 1967.

During his association with the club he served on the committee at various times.

I first met Greg in 1973 when I joined the MSCAV, and although we lost contact the acquaintance was renewed when I rejoined the club in 1980. Working in Footscray adjacent to the Geelong rail line, I became very used to Greg giving three or four short toots on the train whistle as he passed my work on a trip to Geelong or Warrnambool, so much so that my students and work associates also new when he was passing by. No more will the whistle blow.

Later returned to camp where again we drank and talked well into the night before turning in.



- b/ Placing leaded petrol in the tank of ULP vehicle.....\$100.
- c/ Modifying the engine or exhaust system of a vehicle so that emissions or noise is increased.....\$100.
- d/ Owning a vehicle emitting smoke, being excessively noisy or having a defective exhaust system.....\$100.





The 18km ride proved very enjoyable being a mixure of fast sweepers and tight curves.

Set up the tents and RELAX. After a meal of steak sangers we visit the other rallyists then head for bed.

Saturday dawned just great, had breaky then off to the races for the ARAI 500, not much of a crowd compared to previous years, up to McPhillamy Park for the best views. Highlights, watching the top contenders pass the slower riders through the esses and Tony Armstrong (GSXR750) mono-ing between the corners - Wow. After the Arai and the parade of Vintage bikes, a touch of sight seeing - off to Jenolan Caves, 10kms from them we run into low cloud and drizzle. Tony and Gary having wet weathers proceed, the rest of us return to sunny Bathurst for supplies.

Back at the camp site to collect wood for our camp fire a large log is procured but proves too heavy to lift - Ross Gabriel to the rescue, with the log abreast on the big Suzuki we ride it back to camp, "Simple".

Here it's fine and sunny so off with the wet weather and back to a more civilised ride to Albury, on the way we pick up Rod GSXR750 (potential member) from Reservoir.

Out to the Ettamogah Pub for a look and a lager then on to Benalla and the back roads to Melbourne. Ross leads, having lived up this way and knows all the Police hiding spot, BUT they have a new one. Fortunately for once we are travelling at the prescribed speed or thereabouts, (pure a--e).

Before long we are all home having travelled approx 2054km without incident, and not having to shower or shave for FOUR days it was GREAT.



16.(1) Upon any question arising at a general meeting of the Association, a member has one (1) vote only.

(2) All votes shall be given personally or by proxy.

(3) In the case of an equality of voting on a question, the Chairman of the meeting is entitled to exercise a second or casting vote.

19.(1) Each member shall be entitled to appoint another member as his proxy by notice given to the secretary no later than 24 hours before the time of the meeting in respect of which the proxy is appointed.

(2) The notice appointing the proxy shall be in the form set out in Appendix 2.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

20.(1) The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Committee of Management constituted as provided in Rule 21.

(2) The Committee :-

(a) shall control and manage the business and affairs of the Association.

(b) may subject to these rules, the regulations and the Act, exercise all such powers and functions as may be exercised by the Association other than those powers and functions that are required by these rules to be exercised by general meetings of the members of the Association; and

(c) subject to these rules, the regulations and the Act, has power to perform all such acts and things as appear to the Committee to be essential for the proper management of the business and affairs of the Association.

21.(1) The Officers of the Association shall be :-

(a) a President	(d) a Secretary
(b) a Vice-President	(e) an Assistant Secretary
(c) a Treasurer	

(2) The Ordinary Members of the Committee shall be :-

(a) a Club Captain	(d) an Editor
(b) a Club Vice Captain	(e) a Public Officer
(c) a Social Secretary	

(3) The provisions of Rule 23 as far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications, apply to and in relation to the election of persons to any of the offices or positions mentioned in sub-clauses (1) and (2).

(4) Each officer of the Association and Ordinary member of the committee shall hold office until the annual general meeting next after the date of his/her election but is eligible for re-election.

(5) In the event of a casual vacancy in any office referred to in sub-clause (1), the Committee may appoint one of its members to the vacant office and the member so appointed may continue in office up to and including the conclusion of the annual general meeting next following the date of his/her appointment.

22.(1) Subject to Section 23 of the Act, the Committee shall consist of :-

(a) The Officers of the Association; and

(b) the ordinary members of the Committee as specified in Rule 21 (1) and (2) each of whom shall be elected at the annual general meeting of the Association in each year

(2) In the event of a casual vacancy occurring in the office of an ordinary member of the committee, the committee may appoint a member of the Association to fill the vacancy and the member so appointed shall hold office, subject to these rules, until the conclusion of the annual general meeting next following the date of his/her appointment.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS & ORDINARY MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE.

23.(1) Nominations of candidates for election as officers of the Association or as ordinary members of the committee shall be called for at the general meeting preceding the annual general meeting. Nominations are to have a nominator and a seconder and have the approval of the nominee. Nominations shall be received up until the President declares nominations closed at the start of the elections. Spaces should be left at the bottom of the ballot paper for nominations received on the night of the annual general meeting.

(2) If insufficient nominations are received to fill all vacancies on the committee, the candidates nominated shall be deemed to be elected and further nominations shall be received at the annual general meeting

(3) If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated shall be deemed to be elected.

(4) If the number of nominations exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled a ballot shall be held.

(5) The ballot for the election of officers and ordinary members of the committee shall be conducted at the annual general meeting in such usual and proper manner as the committee may direct.

24. For the purposes of these rules, the office of an officer of the Association or of an ordinary member of the committee becomes vacant if the officer or member :-

(a) ceases to be a member of the association;

(b) becomes an insolvent under administration within the meaning of the Companies (Victoria) Code; or

(c) resigns his office by notice in writing given to the secretary
