

Club Membership stands at **65** after one month of renewals. Welcome to new member Simon Wastney riding a Honda VFR800. He is already in the top ten for attendances. Ask him about sailing. He is pretty good at it! We wish him many fun and safe rides.

The **Club web site** at www.melbsportsbike.net.au accumulated **570** hits during **July**, up 130 on last month. Total site visits are **76,486** since April 1996. The counters on the other pages after another month indicate that the 2012 Ride Calendar page took **504** hits (total **23,693** since 28th October 2008) and Great Roads **101** hits (total **5971**). All counters are significantly up, the five ride month and slightly better weather helping.

For **July** the official kilometres (sum of ride lengths) for the month is **1649 km** (down 193 km on last month). Official Club kilometres for the month (people x ride length) is **26,639**, up 8,189 km on last month. That means shorter rides but with higher average attendances. The shorter rides makes sense in the middle of winter. The higher average attendance is weird though we did have two Sunday's where the weather forecast was brilliant (ie no rain) predicted a week out. Euroa with 24 people and Mirboo North with an amazing 26 people certainly bumped the averages. There were no rides in 2011/12 that had more than 25 riders – Licola in November 2011.

The average calendar yearly total is 336,393 km since 2005. This year we are up to **201,154** km with a total of ten crashes. President Ian Payne had a minor spill (22/7) on a roundabout/traffic island just out of Healesville, his CBR1000 snapping a footpeg. He appeared to lose the front end (right in front of me) though Ian felt it was the rear losing traction. Quite a strange crash as the road appeared to be clear of gravel and not unusually slippery, and his tyres were warm to touch.
